A. The Background to the Occurrences of Cherubim in Ezekiel

- 1. In Ezekiel 8-11 Ezekiel witnesses a sad vision of Yahweh's Judgment upon and Desertion of Jerusalem.
- 2. Ezekiel is shown, in a vision, the idolatry in Jerusalem. Ezek. 8
 - a. Ezekiel is transferred by the Holy Spirit in a vision to Jerusalem. Ezek. 8:1-4
 - b. The Spirit shows Ezekiel the idol of jealousy north of the Altar Gate. Ezek. 8:5-6
 - c. Ezekiel sees elders of Israel worshiping images carved on the temple walls. 8:7-13
 - d. Ezekiel sees women weeping for Tammuz at the North Temple Gate. 8:14-15
 - e. Ezekiel sees men worshiping the sun in the Temple Court. 8:16
 - f. Yahweh promises to deal with the House of Judah in wrath without pity. 8:17-18.

3. Ezekiel witnesses, in a vision, Yahweh's execution of Idolaters. Ezek. 9:1-10

- a. Yahweh calls six executioners to Jerusalem. 9:1-2
- b. The glory of God departs from the cherub to the temple threshold. 9:3a. What is the significance of this first mention of "cherub" in Ezek. 9?
- c. A linen-clad man marks out those anguished by idolatry to spare them from execution. 9:4
- d. The executioners slay people in the temple and in the city. 9:5-7
- e. Ezekiel expresses horror at Yahweh's destroying the whole remnant of Israel. 9:8
- f. Yahweh refuses to show pity. 9:9-10
