¹ As commonly understood, Deuteronomy consists of a series of addresses by Moses variously beginning in 1:5, 5:1, 27:1, 29:1, 31:2 or perhaps better, 31:30, and 33:1. While this is true, the various divisions of the address are, in my estimation, incidental to Moses' *written* intentions, namely to expound the Law (1:5). So *all* the sections contribute toward this theme of *teaching* the Law and *exhorting* the people to *follow* it in following Yahweh.

The idea, noted in Ryrie's Study Bible (*RSB*), that this pattern in Deuteronomy follows a typical suzerainty treaty form of that day is also valid. Nevertheless, the treaty form is insufficiently pertinent to Moses' intentions or to the "thought process" of the document to incorporate it into the outline.
