This leads to the application that a Christian's joy does not need to depend on his circumstances but on his Lord (thus the theme, "Joy in Jail"). The Christian's attitude key is to be found in 3:1 and 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord!" For a fuller treatment on the presence of joy in Philippians, see the Addendum at the end of the outline, "Occurrences of Joy in Philippians."

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Addendum

Occurrences of Joy in Philippians

5479, chara, χαρα, joy

- 1. **Joy over seeing people come to know Jesus:** Philippians 1:3-5 3 "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, 4 Always in every prayer of mine for you all making request with *joy*, 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.
- 2. **Joy in knowing the things of God, including the gospel** Philippians 1:25 And having this confidence, I know that I shall abide and continue with you all for your furtherance and *joy* of faith;
- 3. **Joy in seeing other Christians Christ-like in their attitude and perspective:** Philippians 2:2 Fulfil ye my *joy*, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, [being] of one accord, of one mind.
- 4. **Joy in seeing God spare the life of another believer:** Philippians 2:29 Receive him therefore in the Lord with all *gladness*; and hold such in reputation:
- 5. There is joy from Christians with whom we've worked and helped grow in Christ and led to the Lord: Philippians 4:1 . Therefore, my brethren dearly beloved and longed for, my *joy* and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, [my] dearly beloved.

5463 chairo, $\chi \alpha i \rho \omega$, to rejoice

- 1. **The proclamation of the good news about Christ causes us to rejoice:** Philippians 1:18 What then? notwithstanding, every way, whether in pretence, or in truth, Christ is preached; and I therein *do rejoice,* yea, and *will rejoice.*
- 2. Sacrificing for other Christians causes us to rejoice: Philippians 2:17 Yea, and if I be offered upon the sacrifice and service of your faith, I *joy*, and rejoice with you all.
- 3. Seeing another Christian give his life (in martyrdom) for Christ should cause us to rejoice: Philippians 2:18 For the same cause also do ye *joy*, and rejoice with me.
- 4. Seeing another believer whose life God has spared causes us to rejoice: Philippians 2:28 I sent him therefore the more carefully, that, when ye see him again, ye may *rejoice*, and that I may be the less sorrowful.
- 5. We rejoice in the Lord!
- 6. Philippians 3:1 Finally, my brethren, *rejoice* in the Lord. To write the same things to you, to me indeed [is] not grievous, but for you [it is] safe.
- 7. Philippians 4:4 *Rejoice* in the Lord always: [and] again I say, *Rejoice*.

8. **We rejoice when God works through other Christians to help us!** Philippians 4:10 But I *rejoiced* in the Lord greatly, that now at the last your care of me hath flourished again; wherein ye were also careful, but ye lacked opportunity.

- 1. Sacrificing (even through martyrdom) for other Christians causes us to rejoice along with those other Christians: Philippians 2:17 Yea, and if I be offered upon the sacrifice and service of your faith, I joy, and rejoice with you all.
- Seeing another Christian sacrifice his life in service (even through martyrdom) for Christ should cause us to rejoice along with him: Philippians 2:18 For the same cause also do ye joy, and rejoice with me.
