B1 His Pure Motives 131:1

C1 Free from Pride

D1 {1} O LORD, my heart is not proud,

D2 nor my eyes haughty;

C2 Free from Ambition²

D1 Nor do I involve myself in great matters,

D2 Or in things too difficult for me.

B2 His Quiet Heart 131:2

C1 His Composure: {2} Surely I have composed and quieted my soul;

C2 His Comparison

D1 Like a weaned child *rests* against his mother,

D2 My soul is like a weaned child³ within me.
