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Introduction:

Key Verse: Rev. 1:19: “Therefore write the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after these things.

(1) “What John had seen” was the risen Christ (Chapter 1).

(2) “The things which are” refers to the present Church Age – the Letters to the Seven Churches (Chapters 2-3)

(3) “The things which will take place after these things” refers to the events of the Rapture, Tribulation, Second Coming of Christ, Millennium, Final Revolt, Great White Throne Judgment, New Heavens and Earth with New Jerusalem as its Capital City (Chapters 4-22).

(4) It is my belief that each church is a first century A.D. church. I also believe it is possible that each church reflects a period of church history. This latter interpretation is not the focus of this study.

But it also, I believe, speaks either of the Church at large as it will exist just before the Rapture, or else the visible, professing church as it exists in the Tribulation, having missed the Rapture. If the latter view is correct it refers to the organized church, the members of whom were not truly believers. Notice that there are no bona fide commendations for this church. It sounds like a church utterly in need of salvation!
