Be a Doer, Not Just a Hearer

James 1:22-25

When we hear God's Word, it needs to change our lives!

A. The Command to be a Doer. 1:22

- 1. The positive. But prove yourselves doers of the word.
- 2. The negative. Not merely hearers
- 3. The danger: Self-delusion
- 4. What can be said about the person who says he knows God, but doesn't obey Him? 1 John 2:3-6
- 5. Jesus' story. Matthew 21:28-32. Father with a vineyard and two sons:
- 6. Conclusion: We prove our love for God by our obedience, not by our Bible knowledge.

B. Those Who Only Hear. 1:23-24

- 1. The condition. A hearer, not a doer 1:23
- 2. The comparison. Like a man who looks in mirror
- 3. The perception. He looks carefully 1:24
- 4. The amnesia. He has immediately forgotten what kind of person he was..

C. Those Who Do. 1:25

- 1. Observant:
 - a. The perfect Law; the Law of Liberty
 - b. God's Word is restrictive to the world, liberating to the obedient Christian.

2. Obedient: He abides by it; he's not a forgetful hearer but an effective doer.

Example. Ezra reading the Law to Israel. Ezra 8-10

- a. There was a reading of the Law. 8:1-12
- b. They celebrated the Feast of Booths. 8:13-18
- c. There was confession. 9:1-37
- d. The commitment of Leaders. 9:1-10:27
- e. The commitment of People. 10:28-39
- f. What happened? When they heard God's Word, it changed their lives!
- 3. Rewarded: This man will be rewarded in what he does.
 - a. A Case Study
 - b. If we obey God's Word, we will be blessed in this life, and rewarded in the next.

The Bottom Line:

When we hear God's Word,

it had better change our lives!
