

Jim's Paragraph Titles for Jonah

Jonah 1:1-3. Title: The prophet Jonah defies God's instruction.

Jonah 1:4-6. Title: God's great storm and the praying sailors.

Jonah 1:7-9. Title: The sailors cast lots and identify Jonah as the cause of their catastrophe.

Jonah 1:10-14. Title: The fearful sailors reluctantly decide to toss Jonah into the sea, begging the LORD for mercy.

Jonah 1:15-16. Title: The sailors threw Jonah into the sea. When the sea stopped its raging, they feared the LORD greatly, offered a sacrifice to Him and made vows to Him!

Jonah 1:17. Title: The LORD appointed a large fish to swallow Jonah for 3 days and nights!

Jonah 2:1. Title: Jonah prayed to the LORD from the belly of the fish.

Jonah 2:2-7. Title: Jonah prayed to the LORD in his distress while drowning, and the LORD rescued him before he died.

Jonah 2:8-9. Title: Jonah repented of his idolatry and resolved to thank God publicly and to keep the vow he has made.

Jonah 2:10. Title: The LORD commanded the fish, and it obeyed and vomited Jonah upon dry land.

Jonah 3:1-4. Title: Jonah obeyed God and pronounced judgment upon Nineveh.

Jonah 3:5-9. Title: The People of Nineveh and their Leaders show humility and repent to avert disaster!

Jonah 3:10. Title: Because of their repentance, God relented of the evil that He had promised against the people of Nineveh.

Jonah 4:1-4. Title: Jonah was greatly displeased and angry at God for sparing Nineveh.

Jonah 4:5-8. Title: Jonah sat at the east of the city to see what would become of Nineveh. God appointed a plant, a worm, and a scorching east wind to comfort, then dismay Jonah, who again requested to die.

Jonah 4:9-11. Title: God asked Jonah to justify his anger at the dead plant, then asked Jonah why He, God, should not have compassion on the children and cattle of Nineveh!
